Abortion

Dan Sullivan is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and supports legal protection for unborn children.

Dan Sullivan supports the bill to protect unborn children from abortion after 20 weeks, when they are capable of experiencing excruciating pain during abortions.

Dan Sullivan will not vote to weaken existing pro-life laws or policies if he is elected.

Obamacare Health Care Law

Dan Sullivan opposes the pro-abortion, pro-rationing Obamacare law, and he is committed to help reverse the abortion-expanding and rationing effects of that law. Mark Begich opposes the bill that would protect unborn children from abortion after 20 weeks, when they are capable of experiencing excruciating pain during abortions.

Mark Begich supports a policy of abortion on demand,

which allows abortion for any reason.

Mark Begich is a co-sponsor of S.1696, a bill that, if enacted, would invalidate nearly all state and federal limitations on abortion.

Mark Begich voted for Obamacare, which provides government funding for insurance plans that pay for abortion on demand, and will lead to the rationing of lifesaving medical treatments.

Taxpayer Funding for Abortion

Dan Sullivan opposes using federal funds to pay for abortion.

Parental Notice Before Abortion

Dan Sullivan, as attorney general, worked to defend the constitutionality of Alaska's Parental Notification Initiative Act.

Mark Begich voted to spend federal funds on health plans that pay for abortion on demand (12/08/09, Roll Call No. 369).

Mark Begich voted against requiring an abortionist to notify a parent before performing an abortion on a minor girl who has crossed state lines to obtain the abortion (3/22/13, Roll Call No. 64).

Conscience Rights

Dan Sullivan supports a law to amend the Obamacare law to exempt institutions or individuals from purchasing insurance coverage for services that violate their religious or moral convictions.

Mark Begich voted to further empower the Obama Administration to mandate coverage of the abortion pill RU-486, surgical abortion (including late abortions), or anything else it classifies as "preventive services," overriding all federal laws that protect religious freedom and conscience rights (S. 2578, 7/16/14, Roll Call No. 228).
