Abortion on Demand

There have been 61 million abortions since the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision legalized abortion on demand.

Tommy Tuberville is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and supports protection for unborn children.

Doug Jones supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

The *Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act* would protect unborn children by prohibiting abortion at 20 weeks, a point by which the unborn child is capable of experiencing great pain when being killed by dismemberment or other late abortion methods.

Tommy Tuberville supports a bill that would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks, when the unborn child can feel pain.

Doug Jones voted against legislation that would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks when the unborn child can feel pain.

Taxpayer Funding of Abortion

Prohibiting taxpayer funding of abortion saves lives.

Tommy Tuberville opposes using tax dollars to pay for abortion. He also opposes taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Doug Jones voted to allow the use of your tax dollars to pay for abortion. He also voted for taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Judicial Nominations to the US Supreme Court

The fundamental documents of American democracy and freedom, the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, have given us essential principles to be respected by the courts such as the "unalienable" right to life.

The next president may have the opportunity to appoint one to three justices to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Tommy Tuberville supports confirmation to the U.S. Supreme Court of well-qualified persons who will interpret the Constitution according to its text, such as Brett Kavanaugh.

Doug Jones voted against confirmation of Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court.
