(2) in subsection $(a)(1)$, by striking "to perform
such abortions" and inserting "to perform, provide
coverage of, or pay for induced abortions"; and

sional," after "an individual physician";
(B) by striking "and a participant" and in-
serting "a participant"; and
(C) by inserting before the period the fol-
lowing: ", a hospital, a provider sponsored orga-
nization, a health maintenance organization, a
health insurance plan, or any other kind of
