

Where Do the Candidates Stand on Life? Cory Gardner Mark Udall

Abortion

Cory Gardner is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and supports legal protection for unborn children.

Cory Gardner voted for the bill to protect unborn children from abortion after 20 weeks, when they are capable of experiencing excruciating pain during abortions (06/18/13, Roll Call No. 251).

Cory Gardner has a 100% pro-life voting record scored by National Right to Life.

Mark Udall supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

Mark Udall voted to keep partial-birth abortion legal (10/02/03, Roll Call No. 530).

Mark Udall has voted against National Right to Life's position 80 times since his election to Congress – never once voting pro-life.

Obamacare Health Care Law

Cory Gardner voted to repeal the Obamacare law, and he is committed to help reverse the abortion-expanding and rationing effects of that law.

Mark Udall voted to enact Obamacare, which provides government funding for insurance plans that pay for abortion on demand, and will lead to the rationing of lifesaving medical treatments.

Taxpayer Funding for Abortion

Cory Gardner voted against using tax dollars to pay for abortion.

Mark Udall voted to allow the use of tax dollars to pay for abortion.

Parental Notice Before Abortion

Cory Gardner supports requiring parental consent before an abortion is performed on a minor daughter.

Mark Udall voted against requiring parental consent before an abortion is performed on a minor daughter.

Conscience Rights

Cory Gardner co-sponsored legislation that would amend the Obamacare law to exempt institutions or individuals from purchasing insurance coverage for services that violate their religious or moral convictions (Co-sponsored H.R. 940, 04/09/13).

Mark Udall voted to further empower the Obama Administration to mandate coverage of the abortion pill RU-486, surgical abortion (including late abortions), or anything else it classifies as "preventive services," overriding all existing federal laws that protect religious freedom and conscience rights (S. 2578, 7/16/14, Roll Call No. 228).
