The Right to Life movement supports a Human Life Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, such as the one below, which would protect the right to life of all human beings from fertilization until natural death such as the one recommended below:

The right to life is the paramount and most fundamental right of a person. Section 1. With respect to the right to life guaranteed to persons by the fifth and fourteenth articles of Section 2. amendments to the Constitution, the word "person" applies to all human beings, irrespective of age, health, function, or condition of dependency, including their preborn offspring at every stage of their biological development including fertilization. No preborn person shall be deprived of life by any person: Provided, however, that nothing Section 3. in this article shall prohibit a law allowing justification to be shown for only those medical procedures required to prevent the death of either the pregnant woman or her preborn offspring, as long as such law requires every reasonable effort be made to prevent the death of each. Congress and the several States shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate Section 4. legislation. Would you vote for this amendment?
