Abortion on Demand

There have been 61 million abortions since the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision legalized abortion on demand.

Jason Lewis is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and he supports protection for unborn children.

Tina Smith supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

Tina Smith is a co-sponsor of S.1645, a bill that, if enacted, would invalidate nearly all state and federal limitations on abortion.

Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

The *Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act* would protect unborn children by prohibiting abortion at 20 weeks, a point by which the unborn child is capable of experiencing great pain when being killed by dismemberment or other late abortion methods.

Jason Lewis voted for the bill that would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks when the unborn child can feel pain.

Tina Smith voted against legislation that would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks when the unborn child can feel pain.

Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act

The *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act* would require that a baby born alive during an abortion be afforded the same degree of care that would apply to any other baby delivered at the same gestational age.

Jason Lewis voted for the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act*.

Tina Smith voted against the *Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act*.

Taxpayer Funding of Abortion

Prohibiting taxpayer funding of abortion saves lives.

Jason Lewis opposes the use of our tax dollars for abortion. He also opposes taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Tina Smith voted to allow the use of our tax dollars for abortion. She also voted for taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Judicial Nominations to the US Supreme Court

The fundamental documents of American democracy and freedom, the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, have given us essential principles to be respected by the courts such as the "unalienable" right to life.

The next president may have the opportunity to appoint one to three justices to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Jason Lewis supports confirmation to the U.S. Supreme Court of well-qualified persons, such as Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh, who voted this year to uphold Louisiana's pro-life law.

Tina Smith voted against confirmation of Justice Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court.
