Abortion on Demand

There have been 61 million abortions since the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision legalized abortion on demand.

Cindy Hyde-Smith is pro-life. She opposes abortion on demand, and supports protection for unborn children.

Mike Espy supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

The *Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act* would protect unborn children by prohibiting abortion at 20 weeks, a point by which the unborn child is capable of experiencing great pain when being killed by dismemberment or other late abortion methods.

Cindy Hyde-Smith co-sponsored and voted for the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act.

Mike Espy supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion essentially up until birth.

Taxpayer Funding of Abortion

Prohibiting taxpayer funding of abortion saves lives.

Cindy Hyde-Smith voted against using our tax dollars for abortion. She also opposes taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Mike Espy supports using our tax dollars for abortion. He also supports taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Judicial Nominations to the US Supreme Court

The fundamental documents of American democracy and freedom, the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, have given us essential principles to be respected by the courts such as the "unalienable" right to life.

The next president may have the opportunity to appoint one to three justices to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Cindy Hyde-Smith voted to confirm U.S. Supreme Court Justice Brett Kavanaugh, who voted this year to uphold Louisiana's pro-life law.

Mike Espy opposed confirmation of Justice Brett Kavanaugh to the U.S. Supreme Court.
