## Where Do the Candidates Stand on Life? **Thom Tillis Cal Cunningham**

#### **Abortion on Demand**

There have been 61 million abortions since the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision legalized abortion on demand.

Thom Tillis is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and supports protection for unborn children.

Cal Cunningham supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

#### Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

The Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act would protect unborn children by prohibiting abortion at 20 weeks, a point by which the unborn child is capable of experiencing great pain when being killed by dismemberment or other late abortion methods.

Thom Tillis co-sponsored and voted for the Pain-Capable Unborn Child Protection Act.

**Cal Cunningham** supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion essentially up until birth.

### **Taxpayer Funding of Abortion**

Prohibiting taxpayer funding of abortion saves lives.

Thom Tillis voted against using our tax dollars for abortion. He also opposes taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

Cal Cunningham supports using our tax dollars for abortion. He also supports taxpayer funding of abortion providers.

#### **Judicial Nominations to the US Supreme Court**

The fundamental documents of American democracy and freedom, the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, have given us essential principles to be respected by the courts such as the "unalienable" right to life. The next president may have the opportunity to appoint one to three justices to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Thom Tillis voted to confirm U.S. Supreme Court Justices Neil Gorsuch and Brett Kavanaugh, who voted this year to uphold Louisiana's pro-life law.
