

# Where Do the Candidates Stand on Life?

# **Allen Weh**

### **Tom Udall**

#### **Abortion**

**Allen Weh** is pro-life. He opposes abortion on demand, and supports legal protection for unborn children.

**Allen Weh** supports the bill to protect unborn children from abortion after 20 weeks, when they are capable of experiencing excruciating pain during abortions.

**Tom Udall** supports a policy of abortion on demand, which allows abortion for any reason.

**Tom Udall** voted to keep partial-birth abortion legal (10/2/03, Roll Call No. 530).

#### **Obamacare Health Care Law**

**Allen Weh** opposes the pro-abortion, pro-rationing Obamacare law, and he is committed to help reverse the abortion-expanding and rationing effects of that law. **Tom Udall** voted for Obamacare, which provides government funding for insurance plans that pay for abortion on demand, and will lead to the rationing of lifesaving medical treatments.

## **Taxpayer Funding for Abortion**

**Allen Weh** opposes using federal funds to pay for abortion.

**Tom Udall** voted to spend federal funds on health plans that pay for abortion on demand (12/08/09, Roll Call No. 369).

### **Parental Notice Before Abortion**

**Allen Weh** supports requiring parental notice before an abortion is performed on a minor daughter.

**Tom Udall** voted against requiring an abortionist to notify a parent before performing an abortion on a minor girl who has crossed state lines to obtain the abortion (3/22/13, Roll Call No. 64).

### **Conscience Rights**

**Allen Weh** supports an amendment to Obamacare to exempt institutions or individuals from purchasing insurance coverage for services that violate their religious or moral convictions.

**Tom Udall** voted to further empower the Obama Administration to mandate coverage of the abortion pill RU-486, surgical abortion (including late abortions), or anything else it classifies as "preventive services," overriding all federal laws that protect religious freedom and conscience rights (S. 2578, 7/16/14, Roll Call No. 228).
